Opening Reflection: prayer to St Kateri Tekawitha (Denise)

NEORSD Grant

-Brenna met with parish administrator Scott Menningen to remind him that the parish has been awarded \$25,000 by the NEO Regional Sewer District for a design grant.

-bids: Jared sent a Request for Proposals (RFPs) to some design architects. He has approached 4-5 engineers and is scheduled onsite tours with companies June 15-20.

-grounds tour: with respect to the NEORSD grant, Jared will ask Facilities Committee to be part of any walking tours

-visuals: Jared will ask for visual for our grant and what will be included in it (maintenance or design manual?). Jared will secure a table for visual display of the NEORSD grant at the parish picnic on August 27.

-Jared has received one bid (Environmental Design Group)

Kateri Garden grants

a) Victory Knoll grant: \$1,000

-Scott Menningen has confirmed that the parish did receive a \$1,000 Victory Knoll grant (which Claire and Brenna applied for) for a pollinator garden with native flowers and plants to be established on the parish grounds , named in honor of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha (17th century, what is now New York State) . b) Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District grant: \$1,500

-Claire is liaison with Amy from Soil and Water Conservation District

Sacred Ground Grant secured: \$1500.00 – Provides financial and planning support Note: Sacred Grounds is a National Wildlife Federation program that recognizes congregations, houses of worship and faith communities who both create wildlife habitat and actively link faith practices and caring for the environment. Administered locally by the Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District. -Claire will write bulletin insert or flyer; Brian can pass it along to Cuquie at the rectory -who will ask Fr Gurnick if we can do a blessing of the area of the yard where the garden will be (NE corner of backyard behind the church)

Outreach to Young Adults

-at the June 12 meeting of Creation Care, Brian told us that he shared with Fr Gurnick and Stephanie Pritts info about Wholemakers, a 10-session curriculum on integral ecology for use in young adult ministry. Created by and for young adults, it weaves together climate science with insights from Catholic tradition, and can be used in high schools, college campuses, and small groups. It was created and vetted by a consortium of young adults, theologians, and experts from Catholic Climate Covenant, Maryknoll, the USCCB, and others. -Stephanie Pritts works with teens; she reported to Brian that their schedule is already full for 2023-24 school year.

-Claudia (parishioner) is one of the young adults listed as a contact for young adult gatherings. Denise and Brian will reach out to her to figure out how to relate to young adults what Creation Care is doing. Would be good if Claire and Brenna could also reach out -we want to get out of our silos by going to leadership to ask if our rep coud attend their meetings and invite one of their members to come to ours -we could invite them to a showing of The Letter

Solar Financing for Congregations

-RE-volv presented a webinar on Wed June 21 that was Organized by Interfaith Power and Light..Did anyone from Creation Care attend?

Purpose: Learn more about the different ways congregations can finance solar; look at options to install solar with no up-front costs, such as power purchase agreements. Because recent climate legislation offers nonprofits a discount on renewable energy investments, many more congregations are considering solar.

RE-volv is a climate justice nonprofit that helps underserved communities go solar, while raising awareness about equitable climate solutions and training the next generation of clean energy leaders.

-Claire reported on her meeting (November 2022) with Jonathan Welle of Cleveland Owns about collective buying power for churches in NE Ohio that want to go solar. This echoes what Mike Foley told us at a previous meeting (Dept of Sustainability - Cuyahoga County)

"Cleveland Owns is an economic democracy incubator that builds cooperative businesses and leads campaigns for community control of resources. We know that in racial capitalism, ownership matters, so we're organizing multiracial, grassroots cooperatives that enable member owners to build wealth and power. We're working towards a Cleveland owned by its residents." <u>https://www.clevelandowns.coop/</u>

-Brian mentioned an upcoming webinar about credits for solar being presented by Catholic Climate Covenant
