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This group was tasked to:

- 1) Revitalize St. Malachi and St. Patrick into a mission church via vibrant liturgies and worship activities
- 2) Stregthen liturgical and worship leadership and find operational efficiencies across both campuses through a single liturgical director and a single worship commission.

Research included:

- Reading and discussing Divine Renovation
- Liturgical and sacramental schedules at both campuses
- Church facility capacities at both campuses
- Average daily and weekend mass attendance at both campuses
- Weekly mass and reconciliation schedules for churches within a ten-mile radius of STM & STP
- Worship Commissions at churches across the Greater Cleveland area
- Ohio City population and housing trends

Topics Addressed:

- **Current problems:** Declining membership, Mass attendance, volunteers, and collections. Aging congregation. STM & STP are currently in maintenance mode.
- **Our vision:** More vibrant, engaging, and life-giving liturgies will help us become a mission-driven parish. We will have turned the tide when all the problems listed above are reversed.
- Liturgical Roles: mostly fulfilled by volunteers in both parishes except:

<u>St. Patrick</u>: Sacristan (priest)

Staff + volunteers responsible for environment

3 staff musicians

No Liturgical director

<u>St. Malachi</u>: 1 staff musician

1 staff Liturgical director

• Worship Commission:

<u>St. Patrick</u>: Meets seasonally. Includes Pastor, liturgical ministries scheduler & musicians <u>St. Malachi</u>: Meets monthly (Sept. - June). Includes representatives from each liturgical ministry, plus at-large members & sometimes clergy

- Mass Book: Two, separate hard-copies currently in use, one at each location, in different formats
- Our Current Condition:
 - $\circ~$ Separate and uncoordinated Liturgy preparation and execution
 - $\circ~$ Duplication of efforts leading to inefficiencies & extra burden on Pastor and staff

• Best Practices:

- $\circ~$ Weekly mass and reconciliation schedules align with celebrant capacity
- $\circ~$ Efficient mass book format, easily accessible by all who need it
- Worship Commission:
 - Encourages full, conscious, active participation
 - Inspires service in the larger community
 - Formation of liturgical ministers
 - Value & welcome all who come
 - Environment as element of worship
 - Regular Meetings:
 - Monthly, seasonally or quarterly
 - Seeks feedback from parishioners
