Charities are broken two groupings for each parish:

- Directed Charities: These are led by the applicable church community. The management structures (staff and volunteers) report to the Pastor.
- Affiliated Charities: These are separate organizations which possibly operate under their own 501(c)3. The pastor does not have supervisory responsibility for the management of the organization. Frequently, the affiliation occurs because the charity shares facilities/campus with either St Patrick or St Malachi (i.e., Malachi Center, Saint Vincent de Paul, IRTF, Stella Maris, Malachi House).

Note: It was a struggle to define the scope "Ministries of Charity. This heading overlaps many ministries with social action, spiritual and other focus areas. Future discussion and discernment is required.

Meets for mass and brings commmunion to the homebound.	











Run by: SVDP-hired staff person + volunteers

-Hot Meal - Tues & Thurs - ~100 guests, 25 partner parishes/organizations prepare and serve food.

-**Food Pantry** - 1st & 3rd Wednesdays mornings, 100-160 households served.

St. Vincent de Paul - St. Patrick Conference

Run by: volunteer (Joe Wadowick) - PAUSED

Financial assistance for housing/utilities, funding from yearly raffle, envelopes, donations. Distributes approx. \$50K annually to 1,000 recipients

IRTF- Inter Religious Task Force on Central America

Run by: IRTF employee & volunteers

Education and advocacy organization, about issues of human rights and the need for social justice in Central and South America, sale of Fair Trade items.

Stella Maris

Run by: Stella Maris employees

A stand-alone detox providers where clients can move through a full continuum of care. St. Patrick Mission House leased for 19-bed residential addiction recovery (women only).

St. Malachi Directed Charities

Back Door Ministry

Run by: 2 part-time employees, 1 contracted host

M-F, 10am-1pm, 200-300 served daily, varied take out meals. Food primarily donated. Expenditures for paper products and additional food.

Saturday Morning Breakfast

Run by: Br. Phil & 1 part-time employee

Serves 200+ meals, dine-in style. 8 rotating volunteer groups cook, serve and clean up. \$300-\$400 cost/week for food expenses, plus paper products.

Monday Night Meal

Run by: St. Malachi volunteers

200-300 meals served to 120-180 participants, sit down and take out, Mon nights 5-6pm, Main course is donated by individual volunteer cooks who prepare a meal at home that serves approximately 25 – 30 people. Ten to thirteen cooks per week. Fruit donated by volunteers, bread and donuts donated by bakeries. \$100-180 supplemental food cost weekly, paper products purchased.

Food Fund

Run by: St. Malachi volunteers

Donates monthly to Malachi Center, Malachi House, and Little Brothers and Sisters of the Eucharist. Christmas (formerly fruit baskets) - \$10 gift cards distributed in hand-written Christmas cards to residents of Lakeview Terrace High Rise. ~200 cards distributed, excess returned to Mother Teresa Ministry.

Mother Teresa Ministry

Run by: Staff and volunteers

Financial assistance for housing and utilities. Distributes approximately \$12,000. Individual gifts are capped at \$200/month.

Samaritan Ministry

Run by: voluneers (2-4 members)

Workshops for families and others connected to individuals with alcohol and/or other drug issues. Trains 30 people 2/year. Pre-existing funding, attendance is free. Optional donations to Mother Teresa Fund

Friendly Visitor

Run by: Staff

Communion and homebound visits

Social Action

Malachi Center

Run by: volunteers

Collections for partner organizations; educate parishioners at Coffee Hour on social issues such as border initiatives, Matthew 25 statues, letter writing, etc.

St. Malachi Affiliated Charities







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Independent 501c3, Independent Board

Serves youth with after-school program, summer camp, additional activities for teen girls. Monthly special family events, showers for homeless (7-12 people daily), weekly sewing classes, assistance with State Documents, collects and distributes toiletries to clients because they are not covered by SNAP.

Stella Maris

Independent 501c3, Independent Board

A stand-alone detox provider where clients can move through a full continuum of care. St. Malachi Convent leased for 17-bed residential addiction recovery. Soon to purchase Malachi rectory for 19-bed facility.

Malachi House

Independent 501c3, Independent Board

Home for the dying poor. Accomodates 15 residents.
